

#### AAUW FIGHTS FOR PROTECTION OF PREGNANT WORKERS

Because she excelled at her job, Chelsey Glasson advanced steadily in her career—until she spoke out about the egregious pregnancy discrimination she saw and then experienced herself.

Her boss made frequent remarks about a team member being "...likely pregnant... again" and "overly emotional when pregnant." When she reported the behavior, her manager started interviewing people to replace her. And that was just the beginning.

When Glasson announced she herself was pregnant, her boss forced her to transfer to another team. The retaliation worsened when she experienced a complication requiring early maternity leave. No woman should have to suffer the stress of discrimination during pregnancy – or ever.

But, thanks to supporters like you, Glasson is fighting back—in court. This summer, AAUW adopted her case, which is now in the Superior Court of Washington State.
