THE NOT-SO-SIMPLE TRUTH ABOUT THE LATEST PAY GAP DATA

Last week, the U.S. Census Bureau and Bureau of Labor Statistics released data indicating that, in 2020, women were paid 83 cents for every dollar paid to men.
