## MARCH PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

#### Women in Action: The Paradise and Creek Fires

Presented by Dena Traina

Dena talked about the Perfect Storm of Climate Change with aging infrastructure and inadequate funding. With green house gases rising, global surface temperatures going up and mean sea level above its historic levels, there are many things that we are having to adapt to as a nation and a world.

Even in Merced the likelihood of your house flooding in the next 15 years is about 10 % higher than it is today. She knows, hard to believe when we are in the middle of a drought. But that is one of the things with climate change is there are large swings in the weather patterns. Most of California is predicted to have heavier rain events in the next 15 years. So you can protect your house by doing things like cleaning your gutters, installing sealants and coating on the exterior of your house, capture rain in rain barrels and make sure your property drains away from your house.

The fire risk from climate change is also going up in California. There are new rules about Defensible Space and the sale of homes that now need to be complied with. You can do lots of things to protect your property from ignition resistant construction, enclosing under your eaves, creating a defensible space and many others.

American Society of Civil Engineers rates California's infrastructure as a C-. There are bridges within our neighborhood that are rated in poor condition. The infrastructure bill that passed will barely touch the number of repairs that need to be made to keep our infrastructure safe.

## Exploring Tough Policy Issues through an AAUW Lens: The Student Debt Crisis

#### Tuesday, May 3, 2022, 4 p.m. ET

Join AAUW's Public Policy team as they and guest speakers explore the realities and possible misconceptions about student debt.

Women hold around two-thirds of the country's \$1.7 trillion of student debt, according to AAUW's report, *Deeper in Debt: Women and Student Loans*. Because of the gender pay gap, they have less income with which to repay their loans. Student debt erodes economic security and is particularly burdensome for women of color. Our panelists will discuss their research and efforts to help borrowers and halt abuses by the student loan industry.

Panelists include **Katherine Welbeck**, director of advocacy from the Student Borrower Protection Center, and **Natalia Abrams**, president and founder of the Student Debt Crisis Center.
